## David,

Here are my comments about the manuscript. I don't have all that much to tell you, but I noted down a few points that might be useful to you. I am also sending along a copy of my talk—in rough form—that I gave at the conference. I will be polishing that up for the *Windbell* that will be published later this year. Anyway, here are the things you might want to correct or amend in the book:

1. In the Sōtō denomination, a regulation banning lodging women in temples was on the books until 1906. Opposition to clerical marriage remained strong until WWII and even then, marriage was not viewed positively by many Sōtō leaders.

2. Until 1925 Komazawa University was called Sö\*\* thū Daigakurin or, from 1905–1925, Sötöshū Daigakurin.

3. Here are the dates and relationships between some of the teachers that influenced Suzuki rōshi:

I. Nishiari Bokusan (1821–1910)

- 1. teacher to Oka Sōtan, Kishizawa Ian, and many other important Sōtō clerics
- 2. Became Kanchō of the Sōtōshū in 1902
- 3. Expert on Zenkai and Shōbōgenzō
- A. Oka Sōtan 丘宗潭(1860-1921)
  - 1. studied with Nishiari Bokusan
  - 2. Lectured at the Eiheiji Shöbögenzö e in 1905
  - 3. Became kan'in at Eiheiji in 1917
  - founded Antaiji in Kyoto in 1925
  - two of his most important stude down for aki Ködo and Hashimoto Ekö
- B. Kishizawa Ian 岸沢維安 (1865)
  - 1. ordained by Nishiari Bokusaa -
  - 2. received shihō from Nishiari Robert and 1901
  - 3. also studied with Oka Sōtan
  - 4. like his teacher he was an experimentative ranks, Shöbögenzö, and Zenkai; also published a book on the Sandökai, which may have influenced Suzuki
  - 5. served as abbot for a time at Antaiji
  - 6. served as both seidō and Shōbōgenzōe lecturer at Eiheiji
- C. Kitano Genpō 北野元峰 (1842-1933)
  - 1. Studied under Ötori Sesső
  - 1. received shihō from Soshin Rōchū 案信書衷
  - 2. became Inspector General 総監 of missionary activity in Korea in 1911

- 3. became kanshū at Eiheiji and Kanchō in 1920
- 4. labored to quell the seccession dispute between Eiheiji and Sõjiji

D. Shōbōgenzōe (Annual lecture assembly on Shōbōgenzō at Eiheiji): several influential teachers in Suzuki rōshi's life lectured in this annual series at Eiheiji

- 1. Began in 1905 (M. 38) as part of the commemoration of Dōgen's 650th death anniversary (1909)
- 2. the lectures were held annually after that time
- 3. among the major influences on Suzuki, the following were lecturers
  - a. Oka Sōtan: served as lecturer five times
  - b. Kishizawa Ian: lectured every year from 1919-1931
